Among the many magnificent "Lives of St. Rita" written by the Italian and Spanish Augustinians, we prefer that written by our brother religious, Father Joseph Sicardo. As his book has had a large propaganda in Spain, the Philippine Islands and in Spanish America, we have hopes that the same book, garbed in an English dress, will help to keep alive that fire of devotion which now burns in the hearts of so many clients of St. Rita in North America. That our translation of Father Sicardo's Life of St. Rita may have the result of further increasing not only the veneration, but also the number, of the clients of our sister, St. Rita, is our only wish and ambition.

Buddhism in the United States is often viewed in connection with practitioners in the Northeast and on the West Coast, but in fact, it has been spreading and evolving throughout the United States since the mid-nineteenth century. In *Dixie Dharma*, Jeff Wilson argues that region is crucial to understanding American Buddhism. Through the lens of a multid denominational Buddhist temple in Richmond, Virginia, Wilson explores how Buddhists are adapting to life in the conservative evangelical Christian culture of the South, and how traditional Southerners are adjusting to these newer members on the religious landscape. Introducing a host of overlooked characters, including Buddhist circuit riders, modernist Pure Land priests, and pluralistic Buddhists, Wilson shows how regional specificity manifests itself through such practices as meditation vigils to heal the wounds of the slave trade. He argues that southern Buddhists at once use bodily practices, iconography, and meditation tools to enact distinct sectarian identities even as they enjoy a creative hybridity.

Rut, Rot, or Revival

Fr. Paul of Moll was a Benedictine monk in Flanders, where he developed a wide reputation for sanctity. Not only did he work miracles, but his prayers for friends and petitioners were remarkably effective, and he made numerous predictions which came true. His knowledge of heavenly topics seems almost angelic, and for this reason his friends recorded many of his sayings. FR PAUL OF MOLL: BENEDICTINE WONDER-WORKER contains a brief sketch of his life, a large number of his wonders, some of his letters, and a long list of his holy sayings, which alone are worth the price of the book. Further, it contains Pope St. Gregory the Great's short biography of St. Benedict, to whom Fr. Paul of Moll was especially devoted and whom he particularly fostered as a most powerful patron saint. Also included is an explanation of the St. Benedict medal, the most indulgenced medal in the Church, and one whose use Fr. Paul especially advocated. Fr. Paul of Moll is undoubtedly and extraordinary saint. He was often beset by the devils, regularly used the discipline on himself, and had numerous apparitions of Our Lord, Our Lady, the Saints and the Poor Souls in Purgatory. The faithful flocked to him for prayers and advice. And three years after his death, his body was found in a state of incorruption.

A Devotional Guide to the Gospels

This newly reprinted collection of prayers is the "Irish" version of the popular St. Anthony's Treasury. This older version of the Treasury was printed with the permission of William Joseph Walsh, Archbishop of Dublin in 1885-1921. Besides devotions to St. Anthony, it contains many prayers to St. Patrick, St. Bridget, and other beloved Irish saints. St. Anthony of Padua (1195-1231, feast day June 13), was a Portuguese Franciscan and one of the most beloved Saints of the Catholic Church. He was declared Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII in 1946. As the Roman Breviary says of him: "His wisdom and fluency were very marked, and drew on him such admiration of men, that the Pope, once hearing him preach, called him 'The Ark of the Covenant.' One of his chief points was to expend all his strength in attacking heresies, whence he gained the name of the Heretics' Everlasting Hammer." St. Anthony was traditionally displayed with a flame in his hand, symbolizing his zeal for the Catholic Faith. Since our own time is so much plagued with religious indifference and immorality, may the devotion to this Franciscan preacher of peace and to the Catholic traditions of Ireland bring unto us a real zeal for our Holy Catholic Faith.
