Hind Swaraj, Or, Indian Home Rule

The book deals mainly with direct mass determination by means of a conventional balances. Ethnomusicology

These factors, he argues, have a significant effect on social media use, suggesting that social media in South India, while seeming to induce societal change, actually remains bound by local traditions and practices.
