Continuous improvement is a vital aspect of the ACHS criteria and facilitates the movement from status quo to the desired state; therefore, change is necessary, and change management may be useful. Objectives: To identify the current level of evidence regarding change management with respect to hospital accreditation and to identify the common change management tools that may be relevant to hospital accreditation. Methods: The primary method was a search of MEDLINE and PubMed for articles published between January 2001 and April 2011. Grey literature was identified via a Google search. Unpublished data was retrieved from an on-going qualitative study of hospital accreditation in Hong Kong. Results: No literature with the keywords "change management" and "hospital accreditation" were found in MEDLINE or PubMed. By adjusting these keywords to identify articles about change management in healthcare, 84 citations were identified, 18 of which were included for review. The majority of the literature described increased communication as a change management intervention. Change management framework and tools were

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also found in the grey literature review. Results: No literature with the keywords "change management" and "hospital accreditation" were found in MEDLINE or PubMed. By adjusting these keywords to identify articles about change management in healthcare, 84 citations were identified, 18 of which were included for review. Purpose of the study: CPR learning and standardization of training programs is recommended for all clinicians involved in direct patient care, but not always easy due to shift patterns, environmental factors even with a supportive hospital management team. Joint Commission International (JCI) accreditation is considered the gold standard in global health care and for all hospital workers JCI recommend the undertaking of CPR training. Torre Vieja Hospital is University accredited with 277 beds and 1382 workers. Since accreditation we have improved and maintained the ability to facilitate the program of CPR Materials and methods: According to JCI standards: 1. Staff members providing direct care to patients or other personnel must receive training at an appropriate level. 2. All staff that have undergone training are assessed on theory and practical skills. The hospital has evidence that

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staff have completed and passed their CPR training.<sup>3</sup>It is recommended that every two years all staff receive a refreshment course. We have developed a program for training for all staff in basic life support (BLS )with theory and a practical of 2 hours for all the staff. However we also provide an advanced life support within paediatrics ( ALS ) program 16 hours and 8 hours (refresher), for target staff (ICU, emergency room, operating room, percutaneous coronary angioplasty laboratory staff, on call senior and nursing staffu2026)Results: prior to JCI less than 20% of the staff were trained in BLS and about 30 people received ALS training every year.Currently 82% Torre Vieja Hospital staff including health centers have received CPR training . Out of this 152 workers have undertaken ALS.Our goal is to continue training and monitoring all our staff in BLS with refreshment course being provided every 2 years ,as well as training in ALS to all staff involved in specific areas that have higher risk of cardiac arrest.Conclusions: thanks to the assistance of JCI accreditation the hospital management even though have many health care provider demand, the team still has a continued desire and commitment ensuring that all current and future staff receive adequate and appropriate CPR training and subsequent refresher courses.

The Institute of Medicine study *Crossing the Quality Chasm* (2001) recommended that an interdisciplinary summit be held to further reform of health professions education in order to enhance quality and patient safety. *Health Professions Education: A Bridge to Quality* is the follow up to that summit, held in June 2002, where 150 participants across disciplines and occupations developed ideas about how to integrate a core set of competencies into health professions education. These core competencies include patient-centered care, interdisciplinary teams, evidence-based practice, quality improvement, and informatics.
