A Hermit's Secret tells the story of a lifelong friendship that forms between a mysterious hermit and a high school boy. The hermit, who appears in a rural community of southern Greece with only a guitar, is a total enigma to the local inhabitants. No one knows who he is, or where he has come from. Even his name is shrouded in mystery. He appears to be well-educated and behaves as if he is of noble birth; because he is always instrumental in resolving disputes among local people, he acquires the name Nestor. He befriends a local high school boy, Theovulos Theo for short who wants to know the real truth about the world around him. Much later, as an adult living in Chicago, Theo receives a message from Nestor via his cousin in Greece that he is close to death and wants to see Theo before his life ends. Within three days, Theo is on his way to Greece and his final meeting with Nestor, curious but determined. His old friend has summoned Theo to his deathbed not only for comfort, but to involve him in a mystery that will soon reveal the old hermit's secrets and change Theo's life forever.

La proclamación de Yhwh rey y la constitución de la comunidad postexílica

Studio di Jorge M. Blunda. L'autore studia il Deutero-Isaia in relazione ai Salmi 96 e 98, sia come una realtà letteraria che come un prodotto storico. In epoca persiana

il Deutero-Isaia mette al centro la celebrazione di Dio e del suo regno. La obra propone un nuevo acercamiento al libro del Déutero-Isaías y a su(s) autor(es), a partir de la consideración de dos elementos que contribuyen a su unidad literaria. El lenguaje de los Salmos no sólo constituye una fuente inspiradora de este discurso profético, sino que produce formas hímnicas individuales ubicadas en distintos lugares del libro. El tema de la profecía deuteroisaiana que más grava sobre sus textos es el anuncio del “reinado de Dios” y la imagen de Yhwh como rey parece constituir la metáfora central. Ambos elementos vinculan estrechamente el texto profético con el Salterio, particularmente con los salmos de la realeza de Yhwh y sobre todo con los Sal 96 y 98. El estudio considera los textos como realidad literaria y como producto histórico. Se da prioridad al estudio sincrónico del Dt-Is, ya que en su estado actual contiene diversos elementos estructurales, que corresponden a etapas distintas en redacción del texto. Pero dichos elementos se toman como punto de partida para una visión diacrónica y una reconstrucción de la historia de la formación del libro. La recuperación de elementos clave de la exégesis de los salmos de Yhwh rey contribuye a una mejor comprensión del libro del Dt-Is, tanto en el plano de su estructuración literaria, como en el de la concepción que lo inspira. Atendiendo a estas características del libro, se esboza una hipótesis plausible acerca de los autores, las circunstancias y la intención de dicha redacción. De este modo, el trabajo vuelve sobre el lenguaje teológico empleado en los textos, para preguntarse por la función de este discurso sobre Yhwh rey en orden a la construcción de la sociedad. La respuesta se revela útil para explicar cuestiones importantes del texto y para iluminar un período especialmente oscuro del Israel post-exílico. El análisis muestra que hubo una edición del libro, estructurada mediante la inserción de fragmentos hímnicos, y centrada en la proclamación y celebración de la soberanía de Yhwh. Dicha edición fue redactada en Judá en los comienzos de la época persa, está inspirada en la tradición litúrgica de Jerusalén y parece ser la obra de una escuela profética formada por miembros del personal no sacerdotal del templo.

In 1818, when Keats was 22-years old, he and his friend Charles Brown embarked on a walking tour through northern England, Ireland and Scotland, starting in Lancaster and finishing 44 days and over 600 miles later, in Scotland, just north of Inverness. This book sees the author and photographer recreates Keats' tour once again. In an informative introduction, Carol Kyros Walker discusses Keats' circumstances and places his trip in the context of the social and political events of

the time. At the centre of the book are over 150 photographs, many in colour, taken by Walker as she retraced Keats' footsteps and tried to simulate the circumstances under which Keats would have viewed the scenes, photographing on the date and time of day of his arrival. Finally there are the letters and poems that Keats wrote during the tour and the journal that Brown later published, all annotated to relate them both to Keats' other works, and to the contemporary circumstances of the journey. The tour, which Keats envisaged as a prologue to his future writing, had dire consequences for his health and probably hastened his death three years later. Yet it inspired a sequence of lively letters and poems that reveal a high-spirited, curious, reflective, occasionally bawdy and immensely gifted young writer.

The 80-page study presents the results of a survey of 42 libraries with tablet lending programs or those just about to implement one. The report gives detailed data and commentary on how the programs were organized, financed and implemented and their impact on patrons and libraries. The report helps its readers to answer questions such as: how many tablets do libraries maintain for loan? Which brands do they prefer and which are they planning to purchase in the future? How much have they spent on their tablet lending programs and plan to spend? Do they load their tablets with apps? If so how do they choose them? How many tablets are lost to theft? Or to negligence or accidents? What is the fine for overdue tablets? What is the length of the lending period? What are the circulation figures for tablets? What has been the impact on other library resources, such as a pre-existing laptop lending program? Or on use of the library's eBook collection? Which libraries do they view as models and what advice can they offer to peers? What services or training are offered to library patrons about how to use the tablets? Data in the report is broken out by library type (public library/public college/private college/special library), by size of library staff, and size of stock of tablet loaned and other variables.
