Dia adalah filosof terkenal dari Yunani bernama Hippocrates (460–377 SM), yang juga dikenal sebagai Bapak Ilmu Kedokteran. Pada salah satu tulisannya Hippocrates berspekulasi tentang peran makanan dalam “pemeliharaan kesehatan dan penyembuhan penyakit” yang menjadi dasar perkembangan ilmu dietetika yang belakangan dikenal dengan “Terapi Diet”. Perkembangan selanjutnya terjadi pada abad ke-16, saat itu berkembang paham bahwa makanan tidak hanya untuk pemeliharaan kesehatan yang dapat dicapai dengan pengaturan makanan tetapi ada hubungan antara makanan dan panjang umur. Beberapa pelopor paham tersebut adalah Cornaro, yang hidup lebih dari 100 tahun (1366–464) dan Francis Bacon (1561–1626) berpendapat bahwa “makan yang diatur dengan baik dapat memperpanjang umur”. Penemuan tentang

makanan muncul pada abad ke-17 tentang hubungannya dengan kesehatan, tetapi penemuan itu belum dirancang secara ilmiah. Pada abad ke-18 berbagai penemuan ilmiah dimulai, termasuk ilmu-ilmu yang mendasari ilmu gizi. Satu di antaranya yang terpenting adalah penemuan adanya hubungan antara proses pernapasan yaitu proses masuknya O₂ ke dalam tubuh dan keluarnya CO₂, dengan proses pengolahan makanan dalam tubuh oleh Antoine Laurent Lavoisier (1743–1794).

Lactose, the principal component of the milks of most species, is a rather unique sugar in many respects---it has been referred to as one of Nature's paradoxes. It is also the principal component in concentrated and dehydrated dairy products, many of the properties of which reflect those of lactose. The chemistry and principal properties of lactose have been thoroughly

researched over the years and relatively little new information is available on these aspects; this new knowledge, as well as some of the older literature, is reviewed in Chapter 1.

Discovering the Lifespan

Publications on emotion (and the affective sciences in general) have exploded in the last decade. Numerous research teams and individual scholars from many different disciplines have published research papers or books about many different aspects of emotions and their role in behaviour and society. However, One aspect of emotional research that has been somewhat neglected, is the way in which emotional terms translate into other languages. When using terms like anger, sadness, fear, disgust, and joy for so-called basic emotions, as well as terms like shame, guilt, pride, regret and contempt for more complex emotions, it is naturally assumed that the emotion terms used for research in the native language of the researchers and translated into English are

completely equivalent in meaning. However, this is not generally the case. In many cases there is no direct one to one relationship between an English term and a term in an alternative language. In fact, there can be significant differences in the way that these seemingly similar emotional terms can be applied across various languages, with important implications for how we review and appraise this work. This book presents an extensive cross-cultural and cross-linguistic review of the meaning of emotion words, adopting a novel methodological approach. Based on the Component Process Model, the authors developed a new instrument to assess the meaning of emotion terms. This instrument, the GRID questionnaire, consists of a grid of 24 emotion terms spanning the emotion domain and 142 emotion features that operationalize five emotion components (Appraisals, Bodily reactions, Expressions, Action tendencies, and Feelings). For the operationalization of these five emotion components, very different emotion models from the Western and the cultural-comparative emotion literature were taken into account. 'Components of Emotional Meaning' includes contributions from psychological, cultural-comparative, and linguistic perspectives demonstrating how this new instrument can be used to empirically study very different research questions on the meaning of emotion terms. The implications of the results for major theoretical debates on emotion are also discussed. For all researchers in the affective sciences, this book is an important new reference work.

Structural Equation Modeling

The true-life adventure of a Western woman who found happiness in Bali, then stayed on in Indonesia to help in the struggle for freedom. This world lasted for only a few years. With war came the Japanese, presumably as deliverers overthrowing Dutch rule but in reality as tyrants. K'tut Tantri stayed on to join the underground movement agitating for Indonesian independence, and was eventually captured, imprisoned, tortured. Then with the end of hostilities she chose once again to ally herself with the Indonesians—this time in their resistance against the British and the returning Dutch. A friend of the leaders around Sukarno, she was instrumental in getting the Indonesian story to the

outside world, and on several occasions she lent herself to enterprises requiring the combined talents of Mata Hari and T E. Lawrence. K'tut Tantri has an observant eye, an understanding knowledge, and she writes with spirit. Her story is a deeply moving personal drama and a vivid commentary on a period of crucial change in an ancient, romantic country.

Short-term or working memory - the capacity to hold and manipulate information mentally over brief periods of time - plays an important role in supporting a wide range of everyday activities, particularly in childhood. Children with weak working memory skills often struggle in key areas of learning and, given its impact on cognitive abilities, the identification of working memory impairments is a priority for those who work with children with learning disabilities. Working Memory and Neurodevelopmental Disorders supports clinical assessment and management of working memory deficits by summarising the current theoretical understanding and methods of assessment of working memory. It outlines the

working memory profiles of individuals with a range of neurodevelopmental disorders (including Down's syndrome, Williams syndrome, Specific Language Impairment, and ADHD), and identifies useful means of alleviating the anticipated learning difficulties of children with deficits of working memory. This comprehensive and informative text will appeal to academics and researchers in cognitive psychology, neuropsychology and developmental psychology, and will be useful reading for students in these areas.
