2019. ECDIS - ELECTRONIC CHART DISPLAY INFORMATION SYSTEMS. Following the introduction of performance standards for electronic charts, the Maritime Safety Committee (MSC), the highest technical body of the International Maritime Organization (IMO), adopted an amended Chapter V (Safety of Navigation) of the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS). - Symbology for displaying Electronic Navigational Charts (ENCs) on an Electronic Chart Display and Information System (ECDIS). These rules now include carriage requirements, performance standards, charting standards & backup arrangements. One major difference in the use of paper charts and ENCs is the ability of ECDIS to display the same feature differently depending on user settings and other conditions, such as a ship's draft. An important example is that ECDIS displays wrecks, rocks and other obstructions with their traditional "paper chart" symbols if they are at or deeper than the depth of the safety contour set for the ship. Dangers that are shoaler are portrayed with the unique ECDIS "isolated danger" symbol. There are 800 electronic chart symbols that all marine navigators need to know printed here in color. Links to official sources, further information and study programs. Explanations, abbreviations, confirmations, terms & glossary are included. This is a full resource for mariners navigating with electronic chart displays. Electronic Navigational Charts (ENCs) used by ECDIS, are vector charts that conform to International Hydrographic Organization (IHO) specifications. Vector charts are compiled from a database of individual items of digitised chart data, which can be displayed as a seamless chart. Used in an electronic navigation system, the data can then be reassembled to display the entire chart image. ENCs are intelligent, in that systems using them can be programmed to give warning of impending danger in relation to the vessel's position and movement.
